A NOTE FROM RABBI SILVERMAN

Dear Friends and Members of CBJ:

When we sold our Community Center late last fall, we received assurance that, when needed, we would be able to hold High Holiday services in our former building on Court Street. Our Community Center, now called "The Spire," is in the care of an organization that has every intention of fulfilling its pledge. For this year, however, other arrangements have had to be made and are being made.

In short, the remodeling of "The Spire" began much later than previously thought. By May of this year, it was clear that the building would not qualify for an occupancy permit in time for Rosh Ha-Shanah. In June, the Rev. Helen Nablo offered us the use of Church of the Pilgrimage for some of our services. (We had already been in Church of the Pilgrimage for April's Yom Ha-Shoa observance, an interfaith event co-sponsored by CBJ.) In July, our CBJ executive board formally accepted the church's offer. The plan is to hold two of our services there: the morning service for the first Day of Rosh Ha-Shanah and the morning service (with Yizkor) for Yom Kippur. The number of people attending services at these times in particular has been such, in recent years, that the Synagogue would not be large enough for all of us to be there at the same time.

Church of the Pilgrimage is the great white church that can be seen when you exit the Synagogue by the usual door. Lift up your eyes, and shift your gaze a little to the left, and you will see the uppermost parts of the church. Close up, it is spacious and beautiful. And it is offered to us as our house of worship for two of our holiday services by a community that values this church as a house of worship. Their minister, Rev. Nablo, has generously offered that we may make such temporary modifications within the sanctuary as to enable us to feel at home there.

It is, to me, such a sign of goodness and peace-building in the world to know that we have neighbors like that. Next year, we may gather on the eve of Rosh Ha-Shanah at the Synagogue and celebrate the morning service in "The Spire," our former Community Center. This year, we are blessed to have such neighbors as have opened their doors to us for that morning service and the morning service for Yom Kippur as well. Stay tuned! It already looks like this New Year is going to be a very special one!

Notes on Yahrzeit observance:

Some customs associated with Yahrzeit observance are: lighting a memorial candle at home in the evening at the beginning of the Yahrzeit period; saving Kaddish during a Shabbat service close to the Yahrzeit; donating to a charity or one of CBJ's special funds in memory of the one whose Yahrzeit is being observed.

Members, Guests and Friends of CBJ:

I am happy to remind you of a program that we offer at Congregation Beth Jacob to inform fellow Jews: both members and their families and friends of CBJ, of the annual vahrzeit dates of their loved ones. Once you have supplied the names and dates (either Hebrew or English) of those whom you wish to remember, you will receive notification approximately three weeks in advance of the yahrzeit date. There is no charge for this service. We feel that it's important to supply this service to all interested Jews.

I realize that our members have furnished this information when they joined CBJ. We ask those of you who have not done so to supply this information again so we can be sure our records are up-to-date and accurate. This program is separate from your listings in our annual Yizkor Book of Remembrance.

CALLING RABBI SILVERMAN'S **HOURS:**


