A MESSAGE FROM RABBI SILVERMAN

Dear Friends: People the world over have been deeply touched by the horrific events in Newtown, Connecticut. It seems to me that everyone I know has been saddened by the attack on the Sandy Hook Elementary School and the slaughter of so many innocent people, including twenty children.


One of those children, Noah Pozner, was Jewish. Perhaps you saw and heard the family's rabbi speaking on some of the news broadcasts and at the memorial observances in Newtown.

Noah's mother, Veronique, a member of her local Hadassah chapter, requested that trees be planted in Israel in memory of Noah. Responding to this proposal, Marcie Natan, who serves as Hadassah's national president, committed the organization to the following plan. Noting that "planting new saplings that can live on in memory of the children and adults of Sandy Hook Elementary School is most appropriate," Marcie Natan announced that "Hadassah will be planting a grove of trees in the Hadassah Forest of the Beersheva River Park in Israel."

I commend this project to your attention. Trees may be purchased at \$18.00 each. Checks should be payable to Hadassah and have the words "Newtown Grove" in the memo space. If mailed or delivered to me by January 18, I'll forward them all to National Hadassah in your name and in the name of CBJ.

Zichronam livracha, may their memories be for blessing.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

I'd like to take this opportunity to update you on the many recent developments affecting CBJ and to thank the many hard-working members who have brought them to fruition. As you all know, we voted to sell our Community Center (which we purchased in 1978) to the Town of Plymouth to be refitted as a performing arts center. That sale has been finalized and, as of mid-December, we have completely moved out. By agreement with the Town, however, we will continue to use the building for High Holiday services well into the foreseeable future. The move was truly a major operation as anyone who has been involved in downsizing a home or business can attest. Our precious items have been relocated to the Synagogue, excess furniture and other hardware items are now housed in a rented storage facility, and thirty-four years of accumulated "junk" was discarded. Also, our Beit Sefer has been successfully transferred to the Synagogue. Our beautiful building, celebrating its 100th anniversary this year, is being updated as well: a new electrical service, renovated bathrooms, and an enhancement to the bimah are all currently in process. Needless to say, all that went into this major undertaking required many hands and minds. I don't dare list the names of all who were instrumental to this project – it would take far too long to write and read and, I fear that I might leave out someone's name. However, I wish to extend my sincere gratitude to our Executive Board, Community Center Sale Committee, Building Committee, Ritual Committee, Beit Sefer teachers and administrators, Sisterhood and Brotherhood, and the many individuals who made all this possible. I truly envision the "return" to our Synagogue as a renewal of spirit with a firm commitment to make Congregation Beth Jacob as strong as she can be - at least for another hundred years!

BEIT SEFER NEWS

In December we welcomed Anne Maddeford as she took over as the teacher of the 3rd and 4th grade class. We are grateful to Anne for taking on this position. As you know by now, Beit Sefer relocated to the Synagogue in December. Though we are still working out of boxes, we're proud how the children handled this move with such ease. At the start of each Beit Sefer session, students go to the Sanctuary for music. After music they meet with their teachers. The two older classes share the downstairs while our youngest class meets in the room next to the Sanctuary. We then return to the Sanctuary at the end of the session for our closing assembly.

In January, our students will be learning about the Jewish Wedding ceremony. This unit will end with a mock-wedding ceremony on Sunday, February 3rd. All students will be assigned a role for this activity. We will also be studying Tu B'Shevat in January. Following the mock-wedding in February, the children will learn about Purim and celebrate at the Purim Carnival on February 24th. Please be aware that we know that this date falls at the end of our winter vacation week. We're hoping that many can still join in the celebration.

Our remaining Simcha Shabbat services are scheduled for January 4th, February 1st, April 5th, and May 3rd. We will be having a Havdalah service on Saturday, March 2nd instead of our regular Simcha Shabbat. Please remember that students are expected to attend at least 4 of these services.

It's been a rewarding year in many ways to belong to CBJ Brotherhood. "Rewarding", that is, if you chose to participate in the varied, sometimes-twisted activities presented to its cast of somewhat suspect characters. On the "PLUS" side, we are just about at the 3,000 lbs mark of non-perishable donated food items to The Greater Plymouth Food Warehouse in just over the last 2-1/2 years. GOOD but not GREAT. We have food baskets readily available at the synagogue for your generous contribution of non-perishable food items.

We've had a number of "sumptuous" breakfasts with numerous presentations that were usually entertaining and always informative. This will most certainly continue into the New Year. We've kind of gotten used to each others company while filling our stomachs and minds at the same time.

Last year we had 36 unusually informed dues paying members of CBJ Brotherhood. This year, with the loss of a few and the addition of a few, we matched last years total. We were certainly hoping to top last years total.....obviously, not the case. We were (through dues and fund raising events) able to contribute ¾ of our treasury to CBJ (totaling \$1,500.00.) Not a fortune, but more than this strange group has been able to contribute in many years. We're still hoping (how childish is that???) to do more this year. I (personally) was all for using this cash on an investigative trip to check on Brotherhood organizations in Aruba.....but noooooo. Apparently no one wants to see their leadership with a deep tan!

This year we're going to try our darndest to see if we can get some of our younger families involved by shaming them while involving their children. We have joined the national organization of Men of Reform Judaism. We hope to utilize their extensive resources to help benefit our small, yet enthusiastic group of misfits.

This year we'll once again be presenting the possibility of an Investment Club as well as a Book Club. Any other suggestions would be greatly (if not enthusiastically) appreciated. We're also hoping to help in the re-dedication of the synagogue on its 100th Anniversary.

"Lotta hoping" needs a "lotta help". Hope you can be there to participate in doing some of the good we do. This is (after all) YOUR Brotherhood. We are still trying to do as much as we can to benefit CBJ and have fun doing it!!!

Notes on Yahrzeit observance:

Some customs associated with Yahrzeit observance are: lighting a memorial candle at home in the evening at the beginning of the Yahrzeit period; saying Kaddish during a Shabbat service close to the Yahrzeit; donating to a charity or one of CBJ's special funds in memory of the one whose Yahrzeit is being observed.

Members, Guests and Friends of CBJ:

I am happy to remind you of a program that we offer at Congregation Beth Jacob to inform fellow Jews: both members and their families and friends of CBJ, of the annual yahrzeit dates of their loved ones. Once you have supplied the names and dates (either Hebrew or English) of those whom you wish to remember, you will receive notification approximately three weeks in advance of the yahrzeit date. There is no charge for this service. We feel that it's important to supply this service to all interested Jews.

I realize that our members have furnished this information when they joined CBJ. We ask those of you who have not done so to supply this information again so we can be sure our records are up-to-date and accurate. This program is separate from your listings in our annual Yizkor Book of Remembrance.
