## PRESIDENT’S MESSAGE

Dear CBJ Congregants,

In this issue of The Tent I would like to share with you some excerpts from my remarks on Rosh Hashanah...

Rosh Hashanah...Head of the Year...the New Year...“Happy New Year” we say to one another. But an article I read recently by Rabbi Benjamin Blech, a Professor of Talmud at Yeshiva University in New York, pointed out that saying “Happy” New Year is not the most accurate. “L’Shana Tova” literally means “Good Year” – not “Happy Year.” But what’s the difference?

Rabbi Benjamin points out that a happy life and a meaningful life do overlap in many ways, but ultimately are very different. To pursue happiness without meaning is somehow shallow and self-absorbed, isn’t it? If you get what you want, you are happy...but shouldn’t there be more? Kathleen Vohs, an author of a study published in “The Journal of Positive Psychology” says, “Happy people get joy from receiving, while people leading meaningful lives, get joy from giving to others.” So in other words, happiness is about giving the self what it wants, but pursuing a meaningful life is about being a giver – it’s about recognizing the superiority of meaning over the joy of the moment. .

Rabbi Benjamin goes on to point out that somehow Jews have always understood this intuitively. “Happy is good,” he says, “but good is better.” Our lives are good when they fulfill what they are meant to. And isn’t happiness derived from living a meaningful life? And isn’t it also true that when we aren’t pursuing happiness...when we are willing to set our happiness aside and give to others, isn’t that when we sometimes find the greatest joy?

I encourage you to consider how you can give of yourself in order to increase the meaningfulness of your life. One way to do this is to give of yourself to your synagogue. We need volunteers...we need involved Beit Sefer parents...we need board members...a vice president...next year we will need a treasurer. So please...won’t you consider the goodness, the joy and the meaningfulness of giving back to our temple community?

I sincerely wish each and every one of you a sweet, happy, and GOOD new year! L’Shanah Tova!

I am happy to remind you of a program that we offer at Congregation Beth Jacob to inform fellow Jews: both members and their families and friends of CBJ, of the annual yahrzeit dates of their loved ones. Once you have supplied the names and dates (either Hebrew or English) of those whom you wish to remember, you will receive notification approximately three weeks in advance of the yahrzeit date. There is no charge for this service. We feel that it's important to supply this service to all interested Jews.

We ask those of you who have not done so to supply this information again so we can be sure our records are up-to-date and accurate. This program is separate from your listings in our annual Yizkor Book of Remembrance.
