
YAHRZEITS FOR the preceding eve (Observance begins ning) "May the Memory of each one abide as a Blessing"

CBJ provides a service to send postal reminders of upcoming yahrzeits. You do not need to be a CBJ member to receive these notifications.

Send requests to <u>yahrzeit@cbjplymouth.org</u> for additions or corrections, or to receive postal reminders. You may provide the Hebrew date of the yahrzeit or tell us the English year and date, and whether before or after sunset so we can determine the Hebrew date for you.



Some customs associated with Yahrzeit observance are: lighting a memorial candle at home in the evening at the beginning of the Yahrzeit period; saying Kaddish during a Shabbat service close to the Yahrzeit; donating to a charity or one of CBJ's special funds in memory of the one whose Yahrzeit is being observed.
