


## Rabbi's Message

### A MESSAGE FROM RABBI SILVERMAN

!On the first Sunday in February, the Patriots won the Superbowl! It was an amazing, defensive game. Afterwards, Tom Brady all but said it: He wants to come back for more. On the first Shabbat, at the beginning of February, our Torah portion was "Mishpatim," the one that follows immediately after the Ten Commandments. Mishpatim is important because it tells us, up front, that an Israelite cannot be forced into lifelong bondage. Mishpatim goes on to give us many rules by which to live. While some of those rules may seem unnecessary in this day-and-age, the principle behind all of these rules is sound: do acts of "Tzedakah!" In Judaism, Tzedakah is much more than "charity" (the usual translation). The word "Tzedakah" comes from a root meaning "justice" or "righteousness." Tzedakah calls upon us to do right by the other people who, for better or worse, are part of our world. Again, in Judaism, this is not an option for us; it is a matter of moral obligation. Tzedakah is calling out to us to help those in need, to the extent that we are able, even as people who live by the principle of Tzedakah are there for us, when we are in need. Back to Super Bowl Sunday. One of the awards given out was the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year Award, given in recognition of exceptional service. This year's Walter Payton Award was given to J. J. Watt, who plays for the Houston team. This individual helped raise more than \$37 million for people in distress because of Hurricane Harvey. In accepting the award, this is what J. J. Watt said: "This award is about the inherent good that lies within humanity. It's about the city of Houston and its ability to overcome adversity at a time when it all seemed lost. It is about the hundreds of thousands of people from all over the country and all over the world who donated to a city they may have never been to, to people that they may never meet. But they donated simply because they saw their fellow humans going through a difficult time and they wanted to help out." Sounds like "J. J." got the message straight from Mishpatim!
